


5. Upon satisfaction of the above requirements for submission of applications Council shall render its classification decision on an application within 30 working days from the date application is received AND shall issue a certificate of classification.
6. On classification the Council may, where applicable:
 - (i) require the producer or distributor to cut-out offensive scenes, re-edit it, etc; or
 - (ii) decline classification altogether and prohibit the publication, showing and/or staging of the material subject of classification. In such cases Council shall state in writing the reasons for its decision.
7. Appeal process:
 - (i) a presenter or distributor who disagrees with a censorship or classification decision for their work may seek a review of the decision from the Council within 14 days of the decision.
 - (ii) members of the public may appeal decisions reached by the Council with regard to the classification decision within one year of the decision.
 - (iii) Any person who is dissatisfied with the decision of the Council after review may appeal to the High Court within 14 days of the decision.
8. This guideline is not a comprehensive account of everything that may at any time be of concern. Should issues arise which are not specifically covered here they will be dealt with on their merits and in line with the standards expressed and implied generally. At all times the Council will stick to the basic tenets of these guidelines subject to normal considerations of fairness and reasonableness.
